Eschatology Syllabus

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

A study of endtimes. We will be presenting differing views of eschatology, but favoring a view which reveals an optimistic future for God's people. We will study the relevant Bible passages, such as Matthew 24, Daniel 2 and 9, the book of Revelation, etc. We will discuss questions such as, What will happen between now and the return of Jesus Christ? What will the righteous and the wicked people experience in eternity?

- I. Rational: What people believe about the future influences their concept of God and determines how they act today.
- II. Prerequisite: None
- III. Program Objectives:
 - A. Cognitive
 - 1. The student will gain a thorough understanding of the major endtime views.
 - 2. The student will grasp the biblical foundation for an optimistic, victorious view.
 - B. Performance
 - 1. The student will be able to teach what he/she has learned.
 - 2. The student will be able to give a biblical defense to others for a belief in a victorious view of the future.
 - 3. The student will develop confidence in what God is doing in our times and the future.

- V. Instructional/Learning Activities:
 - A. The student will read the textbook.
 - B. The student will watch and listen to the 10 lectures.
 - C. The student will take and pass a 10-question quiz after each lecture.
 - D. The student will take and pass the 50-question final exam.

VI. Corrective Learning Opportunities: After each quiz the student will receive a grade and then if performance is poor, listen to the lecture again and retake the quiz.
