Systematic Theology Syllabus

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

In this course the student will lay a foundation by studying the nature of God and then proceed to consider the implications in all areas of theology. The major areas of Christian thought will be addressed in an organized, systematic fashion. The goal is to familiarize the student with those areas, with a special emphasis on open theism and kingdom theology.

- I. Rational: Every Church leader needs a basic understanding of theology in order to understand why Christians believe what they believe.

 - D. The student will take and pass the 50-question final exam.
- VI. Corrective Learning Opportunities: After each quiz the student will receive a grade and then if performance is poor, listen to the lecture again and retake the quiz.
