COURSE DESCRIPTION:

A study of the book of Romans, including Paul's teaching on sin, salvation, the nature of humanity, victory over sin, predestination, our relationship with the Jews, and practical Christian living.

I. More than any other book in the Bible, the book of Romans has been used by Church leaders to develop Christian doctrine. Therefore, an understanding of Paul's teaching in this book is vital for anyone working in the modern Church.

2. The student will develop confidence in conversing about the related doctrines.


IV. Preassessment: None
